Good evening partners. Here's our latest update. Primary concerns are high surf on Thursday followed by potential rain and wind impacts on Friday into early Saturday. Please see below for more information.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

Third Issuance

- Breaking wave heights up to 33 feet for Thursday now a major impact
- Extended high surf potential through the weekend
- Increased weather threat to moderate on Friday for potential wind and rain impacts

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence for a reasonable worse case scenario.

DETAILS


- · High surf peaks on Thursday, but remains elevated into the weekend
- High tides 1-1.5 ft above normal through Friday
- Widespread WNW swells of 33 ft, occasionally to 40 ft, are possible on NW and W facing beaches Thursday
- . More significant rain arrives Friday into early Saturday with up to 3" in the coastal mountains
- Gusty winds along the coast and in the higher elevations on Friday gusts to 45 mph or greater possible
- Isolated thunderstorms possible Friday evening into Saturday morning

What

- → High Surf Warning in effect on Thursday
- → Very high swell from the WNW will create hazardous beach conditions
- → Breaking waves of 28-33 feet are expected on west facing beaches

Where

→ Central and Northern California coastline

When

→ All day Thursday

Impacts and Safety

- → These conditions are deadly
- → Stay off rocks and jetties
- → Stay out of and away from the water
- → Never turn your back on the ocean
- → Keep pets on a leash and away from the water

What


- → Minor coastal flooding

- → Large wave run-up


Where

- → San Francisco Bay Shoreline*
- → North Bay Shoreline*

When

- → Pacific Coast continuing into Friday
- → *Bay shoreline from 10 AM 1 PM Thursday
- → High Tide at 11:26 AM PST

Additional Rain: Tonight through Saturday AM

Weather Forecast Office San Francisco Bay Area Wednesday, December 27

What

→ Light to moderate rain showers with gusty wind


When

- → First system moving through now into Thursday morning
- → Second system Friday morning through Saturday mid-day
- → Active pattern continues into early January

Impacts

- → Allow extra travel time, leave extra space between cars
- Moderate rain with strong winds could cause small trees and branches to fall


